INTRODUCTION

aving participated effectively in the 2 off-cycle elections in Ekiti and Osun states in 2018. The Albino Foundation looked forward to a more inclusive election in 2019. The challenges of the previous elections were a strong motivation for the foundation to continuously engage with INEC and the PWD community.

Under the EU-SDGN project which is aimed at Enhancing the participation of persons with disabilities in the electoral processes, The Albino Foundation engaged the Election Management Body for the provision and effective distribution of assistive aids for persons with disabilities in the elections. To fulfil this, the foundation made available relevant data on disaggregated types of disabilities to allow for persons with disabilities to be mainstreamed in the process. The foundation has also been committed in educating Electoral officers on how to effectively manage disabilities throughout the electoral process to ensure that the barriers faced by persons with impairments are reduced. For the PWDs community, the commitment of the foundation has been to advocate for more participation through voter education in community outreaches in local languages and at the comfort zones of these Persons with disabilities.

The barriers faced by Persons with disabilities has been judged to be the main reason for the exclusion of persons with disabilities in the electoral processes. Previously in Nigeria, the location of polling units was a major challenge and is still eating deep and preventing persons with disabilities from participating in the process. Most polling areas and cubicles are either placed on very high surfaces or on a steep surface. The access to these polling units too is another challenge. Big gutters across polling units with no slabs, fenced area with no alternative exits have all constituted poor access for PWDs. The attitude of personnel has

been another reason Persons with disabilities have not been willing to vote. This attitudinal factor starts right from the home to the public spaces where the electoral processes takes place. Many disabled persons complain about the poor attitude of electoral officers to them during voter registration exercise. The long queues of getting registered, communication barriers for the deaf and complex voter education messages are in a nutshell some of the known barriers faced by PWDs in the electoral process.

The improvement recorded by the Independent National Electoral Commission can be attributed to several interventions made by CSOs like The Albino Foundation and other DPOs. The favourable outcomes witnessed is evident in the provision of the braille ballot guide, more awareness of PWD issues by electoral officers, tangible effort for the collection of data on PWDs by INEC through the use of the form EC40H, location of polling areas on accessible grounds for Physically challenged persons and so on. While there seem to be pockets of challenges, The Albino Foundation is confident that continuous engagement with the EMB and political actors, and with the availability of the disability law, more access will be created for persons with disabilities in future elections in Nigeria.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

n preparation for the 2019 General elections, The Albino Foundation carried out several activities to enhance the participation of PWDs in the electoral and political processes. On political participation, the foundation in previous community outreach programs, identified persons with disabilities who belonged to political parties and were willing and able to contest for political offices in the just concluded elections. These persons received support from the foundation which included capacity building training, mentoring and strategy building. The foundation also exposed these persons to media appearances to allow them talk about their manifestos and the need to be voted for. In FCT and Osun state, 2 candidates contested for the National Assembly position while others could not make it beyond their party primaries. In all, the foundation sees this as a starting point as political parties and the general public are beginning to open space for PWDs to participate equally with others.

On electoral participation, The Albino Foundation continued with community outreach in various Local Governments in Osun and Ekiti states. These activities usually help the foundation to refresh the mind of PWD voters on what they need to know about the election. In Osun state, the foundation visited Orolu and Olorunda Local Government in the company of INEC Electoral officers to further sensitize the community on electoral guidelines. This outreaches were very timely as the INEC staff took PWDs on the recent guidelines released by the commission. PWDs also had the opportunity of asking questions relating to PVC collection, registration and movement on election day.

Similarly, in Ekiti state, The Albino Foundation in partnership with the JONAPWD Ekiti state Chapter, organized a town hall meeting in Ado Ekiti. PWDs were drawn from all the LGAs in the state to be sensitized on electoral guidelines and processes. In the FCT, over 200 PWDs were invited to a town hall meeting organized by the Foundation. The INEC chairman was duly represented by Dr. Ogunmola, National Commissioner as well as the EU Ambassador, HE, Amb. Ketil Kersen and other distinguished actors in the electoral process. Participants had the opportunity of asking relevant questions surrounding the elections. They also expressed satisfaction and concerns on issues regarding Women with disabilities participation in political processes, collection of PVCs for PWDs and Head of Service intervention for PWDs in the public service.

The height of the activities was the training of The Albino Foundation election observers and their deployment. The Albino Foundation was among the organizations who received INEC accreditation as observers in the General elections. The foundation trained over 146 Election observers and deployed 113 in Ekiti and Osun states and the FCT. The uniqueness of this exercise was that Persons with disabilities were employed as observers. This gave them the opportunity of accessing the level of inclusion being provided for them in the process and also see how individually and collectively, they can mobilize more PWDs to participate in the electoral process. The election day observation gave the foundation the opportunity of measuring the turnout of PWDs during the exercise. In Osun state, out of 28 LGAs observed, our team recorded 645 PWDs; with Oshogbo and Ayedire LGAs recording 61 PWDs each and Olorunda recording 55 PWDs. In Ekiti state, 10 LGAs were observed and over 388 PWDs were recorded from the LGAs with Ikere LGA having over 200 Voters with disabilities. In the FCT, over 750 PWDs were recorded across the 6 Area Councils.

We observed that the 2019 General election was a bigger improvement (as regards the inclusion of PWDs) compared to previous elections in Nigeria (especially the recent off-cycle elections conducted by the EMB in Ekiti and Osun states). The braille for the blind and the visually impaired was very visible even though its accurate use was poor. The magnifying glass for persons with Albinism and those with visual impairment was found in 30% of the polling units visited. The form EC40 H which was deployed to identify and capture different types of disabilities in each polling unit was widely distributed in most of the polling units but was under-utilized by the Ad-hoc staff in documenting PWDs who turned out to vote. Challenges however existed which can be traced to the poor distribution of available voting aids and inability of Ad-hoc staff to register PWDs at the point of registration. Other observations and recommendations by The Albino Foundation are detailed in this report for further improvement on processes for the inclusion of persons with disabilities in the electoral processes in Nigeria.

Training Of PWD Contestants On Electoral And Political Guidelines

This training workshop was organized for Persons with disabilities with the overall aim of equipping participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to better vie for elective and political positions in Nigeria. The specific objectives were:

- (1) To build the capacity of persons with disabilities in engaging with political parties within their communities;
- (2) To allow persons with disabilities participate effectively in democratic processes in the project states;
- (3) To empower persons with disabilities in contesting and winning political positions alongside others through proper building of manifestos and also effective use of the media.
- (4) To increase the participation of persons with disabilities in the electoral and political processes in Ekiti and Osun states and FCT.

The training held in December, 2018 at the three project locations -FCT- Valencia hotel, Wuse 2, Abuja; In Ekiti State- Koltotel Hotel, Ado Ekiti and in Osun state- Adolak Hotel, Oshogbo. Over 150 target beneficiaries were drawn from the various disability cluster groups. They were persons who are actively involved in politics, have been successful in their internal party primaries or those who have secretly nursed political ambitions.

In the FCT, the workshop kicked off with opening remarks by the Founder/CEO of The Albino Foundation, Mr. Jake Epelle after a session of introduction by attendees/participants at the workshop. The first paper presentation followed immediately and was presented by Brenda Anugwom from Policy and Legal Advocacy Centre (PLAC) on the topic: 'Fund raising in the Political Process and how to build a Political structure'. Mrs Anugwom started by admonishing participants who had the intention of going into active politics to bear in mind the capital intensive nature of politics, and the need to be strategic in raising funds in order to achieve success in the electoral process.

In the course of her presentation, Mrs Anugwom outlined the effective ways of raising funds during the political process in order to achieve their political ambition. She further emphasised on how to build a political structure. The participants were given the opportunity to give feedbacks on their understanding of the paper presentation. The session ended with a question and answer segment, where Mrs Anugwom addressed all questions raised by the workshop participants.

The second presentation was made by Mr. Charles Ozoemenam on the topic: "Effective Ways of Planning to Contest Elections and Building Political Structures". He spoke on the need for effective planning strategies for contesting elections and how to make a success of it. He further highlighted the importance of building and having a solid and viable political structure within the political party and having an effective and grounded campaign team. At the close of his presentation, participants at the workshop also gave feedbacks on how well they understood the presentation. A special highlight of this session was the opportunity given to the participants to simulate a political campaign where they had to campaign to convince the audience to vote them into elective positions.

The third paper presentation titled "Public Speaking and Engaging the Media" was presented by Glory Ohagwu from the Voice of Nigeria (VON). During her presentation, Ms Ohagwu hinged on the art of effective public speaking and the factors that hinders public speaking and the solutions. She ended by outlining the ways to effectively engage the media and the best approach to adopt as a politician during media interviews. At the end of the paper presentations, the participants were divided into three groups for the breakout session.

Group 1: Simulated a political party with the task of strategizing on how to prepare for election, preparing a manifesto and nominating a presidential candidate amongst them who will campaign and convince the audience on why him and his party deserved to be elected.

Group 2: This group was saddled with the task of writing a public presentation on the need for the audience to vote for Persons with Disability (PWDs), and campaign to convince the electorate, why PWDs deserve their votes.

Group 3: The third group had the task of strategizing on ways to adopt in raising campaign funds to realise their political ambition, and their campaign methods. They were also to outline a logical plan or strategy to achieving their political goal i.e. Drawing up a sequence. Their final task was to design a fund raising poster and ensure the critical elements discussed during the presentation were present i.e. the object, the purpose and the contact.

The three groups made impressive and effective presentations based on the tasks given to them, to the admiration of the audience and facilitators present; which gave credence to the fact that the aim and objective of the workshop which was to enhance the civic and political participation of Persons with Disabilities in the electoral process was achieved. This training approach offered participants a range of activities allowing open dialogue, self-reflection, group activities and role plays.

In Ekiti and Osun states, the training was moderated by Mr. Deji Adefila, a journalist from Osun State Broadcasting Corporation who presented the topic "Effective ways of engaging the media" and Mr. Ayeni, a political analyst who made a second presentation with the topic "Effective ways of engaging with political parties and building political structures". During the first presentation taken by Mr. Adefila, participants were taught on the need to know the importance of media and how to use it. The media channels included the radio, television, Facebook, WhatsApp etc. He mentioned some guidelines politicians need to follow when speaking in public and engaging the media.

The second presentation focused on building political structure. Participants were taught that once they decide to contest for an elective position, they must have aims and objectives for the society and community they want to represent. He urged participants to register with or align with political parties in order to gain visibility. He also asked participants to endeavour to mobilize other members of the community as this is another way of being relevant. Mr. Epelle took the last presentation which focused on Leadership. According to him, leadership can be defined as the process of influencing people and providing an environment for them to achieve team or organizational objectives. He emphasized on character stating that all the contestant should pay attention to these character traits which are capable of making or marring leaders, that is-Power, Money, and Sex.

The Key elements of these training were

- Pre-knowledge test
 Where participants were required to fill a few questions which showed how much knowledge they have on the proposed topics prior to attending the workshop
- First presentation and group work

After each presentation by the facilitators, participants were allowed to think out practical solutions to issues hindering their effective participation and provide solutions. Each group presented their findings.

Training of INEC staff on disability issues

The need for the training of INEC staff began from observations in the Osun Governorship election. It was observed that most of INEC ad-hoc staff knew little or nothing about disabilities. This was due to their inability of registering PWDs who turned out to vote and also giving them available assistive aids to support their participation in the process. In light of this, the foundation in partnership with the INEC training institute developed a disability inclusion manual to be used for the training of electoral officers.

Prior to the February 2019 general election, The Albino Foundation participated in the training for INEC State Training Officers (STOs) in the 6 Geo-political zones in Nigeria. During these trainings, the foundation focused on educating INEC staff on what disability is and the different types of disabilities. Participants were also trained on how inclusion can be achieved in the electoral process by the provision of assistive Aids for PWDs such as the magnifying glass, braille, pictorials and animations etc. Participants were also taught about the various guidelines of achieving inclusion such as location of polling tables, pasting of voting instructions at the polling unit and allowing for priority voting for PWDs. On the Eve of the presidential election during the RAC training, the foundation closely monitored the distribution of over 12,000 copies of the disability inclusion manual which was jointly produced by The Albino Foundation and the European Centre for Electoral Support (ECES) to be used for the refresher training for all Electoral officers.

Town hall meetings were held in the FCT, Ekiti and Osun states to sensitize the community on the need to participate in the electoral process. In FCT, the outreach began at 10am with a Christian opening prayer and the Nigerian Anthem by Miss Oluchi Iwoha, a member of The Albino Foundation. A welcome address was delivered by Mr. Jake Epelle, the CEO of The Albino Foundation (TAF). Mr Epelle acknowledged the presence of the EU Ambassador; Dr Ogunmola, the National Commissioner Outreach and Partnership who represented the INEC Chairman; the moderator, Mrs Ibim Semenitari (the Executive Director in charge of operations at the Archdeacon Brown Education Centre group of schools); the EU project manager Mrs Laolu, and the JONAPWD National president as well as the JONAPWD Chairman of FCT. He welcomed the PWD's and all participants at the meeting.

Goodwill messages were rendered by the JONAPWD Chairman FCT who thanked the EU for the support they have given the PWDs. He also appreciated The Albino Foundation for advocating and assisting persons with disabilities. He thanked the president of Nigeria for signing the disability bill and urged the PWDs to come together as a team and make use of this opportunity given to them to impact their community.

During the plenary session, the moderator Mrs Ibim directed questions to the members of the plenary on issues affecting PWDs. She asked how disabled illiterates especially the deaf who don't understand sign language are reached out to and informed about their rights in order to gain access to voter's education. Barrister Danlami, a PWD and a UN expert responded by saying that persons with hearing impairment are encouraged to learn sign language as this is

the only way they can be engaged. He mentioned that the movement of sign language interpreters began in 2005 and had been seriously encouraged since then. Dr Ogunmola, representative of the INEC Chairman responded on how voter's education could be taken down to the grass root to reach out to the illiterates and how the long queue in the polling unit would be tackled. Dr Ogunmola in reply stated that INEC has provided a different queue for the PWD and this is also written boldly on the posters for the deaf to see. He said that INEC has made forms available for the collection of data for the PWDs. Talking about the voter's education, he said the PWDs were being sensitized at the grass root level by INEC.

Participants at the meeting asked relevant questions pertaining to the upcoming elections and to other panellists present at the meeting. Ms Ruth a lady with albinism lauded the Head of Service and other panellists for a job well done in ensuring inclusion. She complained about her voter's card which she said was fake and her picture was not clear. This prevented her from voting in 2015. Her fear was that even after returning to INEC office, the reprint given to her was the same, which means she might not be able to vote in 2019. Other PWDs asked questions bothering on availability of assistive aids for the blind, persons with Albinism and others.

Dr. Ogunmola in response to the questions asked him, stated that the visually impaired has been provided for to vote secretly. There is the provision of a brail ballot guide which would enable them to read and thumbprint on the candidate of their choice and place it in the ballot without knowledge of the candidate they voted. On the employment, he stated any PWD qualified to be employed as ad hoc staff of INEC would be employed. He also stated that INEC would adapt the 5 employment ratio stated in the disability act and hope to be an example to other organizations. All of INEC staffs have been trained to meet the needs of special people, he added. On priority voting, Dr Ogunmola stated that all PWD groups would be given a separate queue from the abled persons in order for them to cast their votes quickly. Commenting on the complaint on the voter's card, he stated that it would be taken care of by the INEC REC. He stated that INEC would deal with the PVC printing of persons with leprosy.

After a very robust interactive session, other leaders of Civil Society Organizations present lent their voice to disability inclusion. Ms Grace Jerry, the convener of Inclusive Friends Association (IFA) spoke to the audience. She commended the panellist and the EU as well as The Albino Foundation for putting together the meeting. She congratulated the PWDs for the disability act that was recently signed and commended the leaders who fought hard for it. However, she admonished them that it was a time for them to stand strong, be united and work together to push their interest. She encouraged them to all vote and observe as they do so. In closing, Mr Jake thanked the panellist, the entire team of The Albino Foundation led by Mrs Idang and Doxa its organizers. The meeting ended at 1: 12pm.

Ekiti Town Hall Meeting

n Ekiti state, the town hall meeting for PWDs held in partnership with the Joint National Association of Persons with disabilities, Ekiti state Chapter on the 2nd of February 2019, at the state pavilion, Fajuyi memorial park, Ado Ekiti, Ekiti state. In attendance were members of the Hearing Impaired cluster group, Physically challenged cluster, visually impaired cluster, Spinal cord injury cluster, INEC STAFF and staff of The Albino Foundation.

After a brief introduction of participants, good will messages were delivered by group leaders and executives of JONAPWD. Mr. Ogunbiyitan Kehinde, TAF Ekiti and Osun state Supervisor, educated the members of JONAPWD about their civic rights and gave an insight into electoral process and INEC election guidelines. He appreciated INEC for partnering with The Albino Foundation in ensuring the inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in the electoral process. He informed INEC representative of the summary report of the baseline survey on Persons with Disabilities which was carried out by The Albino Foundation to guide INEC on the deployment of assistive voting materials for Persons with Disabilities in the various polling units across the project states. He emphasized that PWDs should request for and fill form EC 40H during the election in order to get captured into the data base of INEC.

The INEC representative, Mr Taiwo Gbadegesin summed up this session by giving more information about electoral offenses and penalties. He promised that INEC will ensure that all plans for PWDs during elections will be implemented. Other concerns were raised by PWDs and they got satisfactory response from the INEC representative and from The Albino Foundation team.

Osun state Community Outreach programs

In Osun state, The Albino Foundation had 2 outreaches in very prominent Local Government with a high number of persons with disabilities. They were Olorunda and Orolu Local Government Areas of Osun state.

The meeting in Olorunda Local government was held at the secretariat complex on Friday 19th January 2019 with over 100 PWDs in attendance. After an introductory session by participants, the EU-SDGN project lead in Osun state Mrs Abdulahi introduced special guests which included: Mr Taiwo A.O (INEC Deputy Electoral. Officer, Olorunda Local Government and Mr Ojo S.A (INEC PWDs Desk Officer, Olorunda Local Government).

Mr Taiwo started his presentation by thanking The Albino Foundation for facilitating the program. He told the participants that it's their right as voters to participate in the election and advised PWDs to come out en masse on election day to vote for the candidates of their choice and avoid vote selling. He said anybody caught selling his or her vote will be arrested. He informed the participants that the Presidential, Senatorial and House of Representative election will hold on the same day simultaneously and enlightened the participants on the how to handle the 3 ballot papers that will be given to them on election day to prevent voided vote. He added that in the previous election in the state, there was a high number of voided votes and as a result, the commission is doing everything possible to prevent and reduce the number of voided votes in the forthcoming elections; and one of such ways is to educate electorates on how to handle the ballot papers during voting process. Finally, Mr. Taiwo told

the participants that accreditation of voters and voting will take place concurrently. He took time to explain the voting procedures and asked the PWDs to exercise patience on Election Day as they will be given priority voting with other vulnerable groups such as the pregnant women and the aged.

The INEC PWD Desk Officer in Olorunda Mr. Ojo started his presentation by giving explanations on Who a Voter is. He said that to be a voter, an individual must be a citizen of Nigeria, Eighteen (18) years and above, free from any incapacity to vote under any law in Nigeria and must have permanent voters card (PVC). He also explained that a person is eligible to vote at an election conducted by the Commission if:

- (i) He/she is a Nigerian;
- (ii) He/she is registered as a voter;
- (iii) His/her name appears on the Register of Voters; and
- (iv) He/she presents a valid Permanent Voter's Card (PVC) at his/her Polling Unit.

Mr. Ojo told the participants that they can only vote in the polling unit where they have registered. He added that wherever they vote, they should ensure that form EC40H is filled for their proper documentation. He further explained to participants the pre- election, during election and post-election activities and procedures.

The Albino Foundation Ekiti and Osun states' Supervisor, Mr. Kehinde Ogunbiyitan implored the INEC staff to ensure the implementation of the following provisions of the Independent National Electoral Commission's (INEC) Regulations and Guidelines for Persons with Disabilities in the forthcoming election:

1. Section 3d which states that:

As much as practicable, all voting locations shall be located within enclosures in public places accessible to every voter, including Persons with Disability (PWDs). Where they are in open spaces canopies will be provided.

- 2. Section 9b (iv) which states that:
 - (b) At 8:00am, Presiding Officer shall:
 - (v) Create a separate queue for PWDs;
- 3. Section 10f (v) which states that:
 - f) The verified voter shall then proceed to the APO II who shall:
 - v) document the status of the voter; if the voter is a PWD by completing the PWD Form EC 40H as prescribed;
- 4. Section 14 which states that:

The Presiding Officer shall allow a voter who is visually impaired or blind or is unable to distinguish symbols or who suffers from any other physical disability

to be accompanied into the Polling Unit/Voting Point Settlement/Voting Point and be assisted to vote by a person chosen by him/her, other than an election official, a polling agent or a security personnel on election duty.

- 5. Section 15 which states that:
 Visually Impaired/Blind registered voters may, where available, use the Braille
 Guide or magnifying glass.
- 6. Section 16 which states that:
 PWDs, visibly pregnant women and the aged, shall be granted priority access to voting at the Polling Units, Voting Point Settlements and Voting Points.

Finally, Mr. Kehinde Ogunbiyitan also implored the participants to sensitize and mobilize their members to participate in the forthcoming general elections and make use of the opportunity provided by INEC in ensuring their participation in the electoral process.

During the questions and answer session, participants asked questions bothering on transfer of polling units, the availability of sign language interpreters for the deaf and display of voter register at polling units in accessible locations for persons with spinal cord injury or persons on wheel chair. The INEC representatives gave answers to all questions asked by the participants. The program came to a close at about 3:20pm. The programme commenced around 11:20am and the opening prayer was said by Mrs. Asiata Ojuolape. Mrs. Abdullahi, the EU-SDGN project lead in Osun state introduced the INEC PWDS desk officer, Mrs. Bakare and The Albino Foundation team. Participants also took turns to introduce themselves.

During her presentation, Mrs Bakare explained the efforts of INEC on the inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in the forthcoming general elections. She explained that there is going to be priority voting and availability of voting aids in all the polling units for PWDs. She also stressed the use of Form EC40H to be used to capture data of PWDs that voted during the election. This will show the total number of PWDs and the types of disability in each polling unit. She said INEC will ensure that all the polling units are accessible as much as possible for all persons with disabilities. Mrs Bakare advised PWDs not to sell their votes during election but rather cast their votes for the candidates of their choice. She also told them to go back home after casting their votes. Finally, she emphasized that they should discourage their sons/daughters from engaging in any form of political thuggery.

Mr. Kehinde Ogunbiyitan of The Albino Foundation in his presentation, appreciated INEC for partnering with The Albino Foundation on the EU- SDGN project for the inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in the electoral process. He encouraged the participants to mobilize other Persons with Disabilities in their local government to come out en mass on Election Day so as to compliment the efforts of The Albino Foundation and INEC. He also enlightened the

participants on the how to thump print on the ballot paper in order to prevent voided votes by using the ballot paper specimen provided by INEC staff. He also informed the participants on their right to request for another ballot paper in case the ballot paper given to them is accidentally spoilt. He said , it was stated in the provisions of INEC election guidelines and regulations that 'A voter who by accident spoils his/her ballot paper such that it cannot be used for voting may present it to the Presiding Officer and if satisfied that the ballot paper is spoilt, the Presiding Officer shall issue another ballot paper to the voter in place of the spoilt ballot paper. The spoilt ballot paper shall be marked "cancelled" by the Presiding Officer, and recorded in appropriate form in the PU booklet. Finally, Mr. Ogunbiyitan reiterated that participants should endeavor to fill the form EC40H for Persons with Disabilities in order to capture the accurate data of Persons with disabilities that voted during the election.

During the question and answer session, a blind voter asked what will happen to those of them who can't read the braille. She added if they will be allowed to vote irrespective of not using the braille. Mr. Kehinde Ogunbiyitan responded that the regulations and guidelines for the 2019 general elections permits a voter who is visually impaired or blind, unable to distinguish symbols or suffers from any other physical disability to be accompanied into the Polling Unit/Voting Point Settlement/Voting Point; and to be assisted to vote by a person chosen by him/her, other than an election official, a polling agent or security personnel on election duty.

Mrs. Oladejo Ganiyat , JONAPWD chairperson, Orolu Local Government commended The Albino Foundation & INEC for the sensitization programme organized for them and used the opportunity to encourage all the participants to come out on time on election day and cast their vote

Training of Election Observers

The training for election observers took place in Ekiti and Osun states; and the FCT with Representatives of INEC Election and Party Monitoring department as Trainers. The focus of this training was to educate and equip election observers who will serve as field officers in the forthcoming general election. This activity created an opportunity for TAF to evaluate the performance of various stakeholders towards the inclusion of PWDs in electoral process. The training would also help the observers to understand what they ought to watch out for and also understand their limits while carrying out this role. To better understand the entirety of the process, participants were given a general view of disability. They were made to realize that disability was not a sickness or disease but rather the absence of rightful facilities to assist people with impairment. Participants were told to look out for PWDs at the polling unit and document how they were engaged. Such disabilities include hearing impairment, sight impairment, albinism, persons with leprosy etc.

INEC representatives in each of the project locations gave an overview of what election observation was all about. They began the session by defining the meaning of election observation. Election observation was defined as a process by which election in a particular country or locality are observed by independent or impartial bodies of observers. During the observation, observes are to observe the activities before, during and after the election. They stated that the observers have rights as well, such as, rights to observe all phases of the electoral process from the RAC to the wards and have the right to issue public report concerning what they observed during the election.

On do's and don'ts, participants were told that as observers, they are only to observe and write down whatever is noticed and not to seek out faults or correct anyone. All observers are to report whatever was noticed and written to the Commission for future improvement. The trainers stated that INEC had the right to withdraw observers who break the code of conduct such as obstruction of the electoral process, seeking to know what parties are being voted for, etc. All observers must be fully kitted in order to prevent embarrassment from security. All observers have the right to observe how election materials are distributed from the head office to the polling unit, however, no observer is to handle electoral materials. They are also not to assist the officials to count the ballot paper after the election neither should they be seen with any party logo. Interview must not be done by an observer and all observers must sign at the polling unit, therefore, accredited observers should familiarize themselves with the polling unit officials.

The second presentation focused on the barriers TAF has been working hard to eliminate-mainly barriers that prevent the PWDs from participating successfully in the election. These were enumerated. Firstly, is the attitudinal barriers which focuses on the attitude of the public such as the police, INEC staff, voters etc. towards the PWDs at the polling unit. Secondly is the institutional barriers which emphasizes on the policies that affect PWDs inclusion in the electoral process. An example was given of the priority voting for PWDs. The final barrier stated was the infrastructural barrier which is the most obvious of the three. It focuses on the available infrastructure for the PWDs to easily access the polling units. Participants were informed that all these barriers constituted what the observers were to look out for.

Also, participants at the training were informed about the types of disabilities and the assistive aids required to enhance PWD participation in the process. For persons with albinism, they require the magnifying glass. Those with cognitive impairment will need pictures to be fully included in the election. Thirdly is the persons with hearing impairment who will require sign language interpreters or pictures to be displayed in the polling units. Fourthly are the persons with leprosy who will vote with their elbows. For persons with physical impairment; ramps, slabs and rails is what is required for them to have access in polling centres or at most accessible polling area is required. Lastly is the sight impairment. For such persons, brails are provided by INEC to include them in the voting process. Participants were informed that INEC is working towards mining data on the numbers of the PWDs at each polling unit. Therefore, all observers should endeavour to enquire if the form EC40 H is available for and has been used to register PWDs who vote on election day.

After the training in the states, the trained observers received their kit from INEC offices and their observation file from The Albino Foundation offices before proceeding to their places of assignment. In all, 113 observers were deployed across the 3 project locations for the Presidential and National Assembly elections and 66 observers for the Governorship/ State House of Assembly and FCT Area Council elections.

ELECTION OBSERVATION REPORT FOR THE PRESIDENTIAL AND NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ELECTIONS

Pre-Election Observations

The pre-election period was peaceful around the states where The Albino Foundation observed election. The political space was heated due to the postponement of the election and several Media houses had heads of political parties talk about the recent happenings as it affects their parties. Campaigns were gradually trickling down however, political parties still organized in door meetings to conclude arrangements. At the INEC offices across the 3 project locations, The Albino Foundation observers turned out to pick up their kits.

Election Day Observations

Generally, in the FCT, The Albino Foundation observation team observed elections in over 500 polling units, 290 polling units in Ekiti and 328 polling units in Osun states. In Osun state, out of 28 LGAs observed, our team recorded 645 PWDs; with Oshogbo and Ayedire LGAs recording 61 PWDs each and Olorunda recording 55 PWDs.

In the 6 Area councils of FCT, over 750 PWDs were recorded. In AMAC- 320 PWDs were recorded while 116 were recorded in Bwari Area Council. In Gwagwalada 55 were recorded while Kwali and Kuje recorded 96 and 100 PWD voters respectively. Observers were not widely deployed in Abaji Area council during the Presidential election due to security concerns at the time of election.

Other observations from the respective Project locations- FCT, Ekiti and Osun states are recorded below:

Ekiti state

- 1. The Albino Foundation Ekiti State team went round the three Senatorial Districts of Ekiti State to observe the level of PWDs participation in the Electoral and political processes.
- 2. The Ekiti State Election was free and fair and PWDs were not victims of violence in polling units visited.
- 3. It was observed that 80% of Polling Units were not accessible for PWDS especially the physically challenged persons.
- 4. It was observed that provision of magnifying glasses was not provided for PWDs during the Election.
- 5. It was observed that there was no engagement of PWDs as Ad-hoc staff in many polling units visited.

- 6. It was observed that 90% of Law Enforcement Agency lack understanding of preferential treatment for PWDs at polling units. This was because they objected when PWDs were asked to skip the queue and enjoy priority voting rights provided by INEC.
- 7. Braille ballot papers were not adequately visible at the polling units, however most electoral staff reported that they would be provided on demand.
- 8. The form EC40H for PWDs was widely circulated across the Polling Units in Ekiti State even though PWDs were not recorded on it immediately after voting.

Osun state

- 1. Generally, from all the polling units observed, priority voting was given to PWDs in most of polling unit while in some, priority voting was not given. Those PUs include: Ward 11/PU 10 Oke Kai, Irepodun LGA, Osun Central.
- 2. It was also observed that the form EC 40 H were not filled because most of the ad hoc staff don't know how to use the form for PWDs. In Ward 04/PU007 Ita Ofa, Ilesha West LGA, the PWDS were asked to put down their names so they can fill the form for them later. This also occurred in Ward 09 Elemon in Irepodun LGA. In some polling units, the PWDS were asked to come back later to fill the form (ECH40) in the afternoon.
- 3. Assistive and voting aids were scarce. In one polling unit, only as one Braille materials was given to the INEC ad hoc staff
- 4. The attitudes of INEC officials, security personnel and other voters were good towards the PWDs.
- 5. It was also observed that some polling units were located in areas that were not accessible to the PWDs.
- 6. In some PUs where the deaf were found, it was also observed that pictures/animation that can make the voting processes faster for these persons were not available nor displayed.
- 7. It was observed that none of the people with disabilities was standing as candidate in any of the positions under any political party.

FCT

- 1. In the FCT, TAF observed election in the 6 Area councils.
- 2. The turnout of PWDs was fair in some Area councils and better in others. But we counted over 100 PWDs in Karamajiji disability colony under AMAC
- 3. The election day also helped TAF discover various disabilities which we did not cover during the baseline survey exercise. For example- in GWAKO and IKWA, under Gwagwalada Area council, a good number of persons with intellectual

- disabilities who turned out to vote were observed.
- 4. On assistive Aids, braille was found in 80 % of the polling units visited within the FCT. The Magnifying Glass was found in 30% of the polling units visited in the FCT. Pictures were found in a few polling units specifically in Gwagwalada Area council
- 5. The form EC 40H for PWDs was widely distributed in most polling units in FCT
- 6. 90% of Electoral officers- POs and APOs were well informed of disability issues
- 7. Priority voting was observed also for PWDs, women and aged in most polling units in FCT

KEY FINDINGS BY THE FOUNDATION

Identification of Persons with Cognitive disability in Gwagwalada and Abaji Area Council in the FCT

The Albino Foundation discovered that persons with cognitive disabilities were present at identified locations in the FCT. This was recorded as a notable observation because prior to this time, persons with such disabilities were usually seen as mentally deranged people and as such should not participate in decision making and the electoral process. Though these persons were assisted to vote on election day, it was observed that they were victims of vote buying and selling as party agents exchanged their votes with money.

Use of PWD as election ad hoc staff

In Osun state, it was observed that some persons with disabilities were recruited as INEC ad hoc staff in polling units in Ilesha and Osogbo LGAs. They included a physically challenged person and a person with Albinism.

Non-usage of the form EC 40H by PWDs

It was observed across all the states observed that the form EC 40H for PWDs was not effectively utilized by the electoral officers. Many PWDs were not registered on the form at the time of voting however, the electoral officers promised to fill the number of PWD voters on the form after the exercise. In a few polling units, some ad hoc staff asked that the PWDs return after the whole process to ensure that they are registered on the form.

Poor distribution of Magnifying glass

The Albino Foundation observed with sadness the poor distribution of magnifying glass across most of the polling units in FCT, Ekiti and Osun state. In some LGAs, there was complete

absence of the device. Many persons with Albinism who were seen casting their votes had very bad experiences to share. In FCT, at Gwarinpa ward, a woman with albinism explained she had a difficult time squinting her eyes under the hot sun. Mr Jake Epelle, founder CEO of The Albino Foundation had to perform his civic rights for the first time, under the scourging sun without a magnifying glass.

POST-ELECTION OBSERVATIONS

The post- election observation period was peaceful in some areas where The Albino Foundation observed election. In Ekiti state, the post-election period was peaceful with no security threats around the city center and LGAs. In Osun state, most LGAs were observed to be peaceful as well. In FCT, a few days after the election, there were pockets of violence obvious in some Area councils which led to the closure of some schools. However, security personnel responded to the post-election threats.

ELECTION OBSERVATION REPORT FOR THE GOVERNORSHIP/ STATE HOUSES OF ASSEMBLY AND FCT AREA COUNCIL ELECTIONS

The Albino Foundation deployed observers for this election in the FCT, Osun and Ekiti states. The summary of each observation from the states are as follows:

FCT

The Albino Foundation deployed 9 Observers to the 6 Area councils in FCT during the Area Council election. The Albino Foundation EU-SDGN team also joined in the Observation. The observations from the FCT were as follows:

- Magnifying glass was available in only 10 percent of the polling units visited in AMAC. It was available in City centre/ Garki Ward.
- Instructional materials were available in some polling units in Bwari Area council however, the presiding officers complained there was no glue to use in pasting them.
- Priority voting for PWDs, Women and elderly was observed
- There was low turnout of PWDs in most Polling units visited
- In Karamajiji disability colony of the FCT, the turnout of PWDs was poor as compared to the presidential Election on the 23rd of February, 2019.
- There was early arrival of materials which made the Ad hoc staff more settled before the arrival of Voters.
- The INEC ad hoc staff displayed more competence on disability issues in the areas visited.
- The form EC40H was filled for PWDs in some polling units
- Security officials within the polling areas were well behaved. No armed official was found around the polling units in the states observed.

Osun state

For the Governorship and State Houses of Assembly elections in Osun state, The Albino Foundation deployed 27 Observers including persons with disabilities. The 27 TAF observers in Osun State covered 24 local government areas. Their observations were as follows:

- There was a low turnout of PWD voters, compared to the presidential election.
- The election was conducted peacefully, no incidence of violence in the areas observed.
- It was observed that most of the polling units visited in all local government were not accessible for PWDs. For example, some polling units were located in high and elevated platform, some across the drainage channel, some polling units were even located on access road. This can be dangerous in case of emergency.
- It was also observed that many PWDs remained ignorant of their right of priority voting.
- Assistive aids like magnifying glass and Braille ballot guide, pictorial /pictures were not
 available at all polling unit visited by all TAF Observers however, persons with visual
 impairment were allowed to vote with the assistance of their aids as it has always been
 the case in previous times
- Similarly, there was no availability of the form EC40H. Where the form EC40H was available, INEC officers did not comply with recording the disabilities found at such polling units on the form. Many of them complained they were too busy and had few staff available.
- A TAF observer, Mr.Babarinde Oluwatobi Paul was embarrassed and humiliated by security personnel in one of the polling units where he observed. His mobile device was smashed on the ground and all the pictures taken deleted. The security personnel said that electoral law does not allow anybody to take pictures during election. This happened in Ofatedo, Egbedore LGA.

Ekiti state

The Albino Foundation deployed 30 observers to various Local Government Areas in Ekiti State during the State House of Assembly Election. The observations were as follows:

- It was generally observed that there was a low turnout of PWDs voters compared to the presidential election although in Ikere local government, a good number of PWD voters turned out.
- Priority voting was not adopted in polling units observed.
- It was observed that magnifying glasses were not visible nor provided at most of the polling units in Ekiti State. The braille ballot papers as well.
- Most polling units visited were not accessible for PWDs
- It was observed in part of the local government that devices of observers were seized by security personnel. This happened in Ijero, Omuo and Ifaki in Ekiti state.

CONCLUSION

The just concluded presidential and Governorship elections in the FCT, Ekiti and Osun states showed the commitment of INEC towards an inclusive election for Persons with disabilities. From the perspective of the Foundation, the challenges experienced as it concerns PWDs can be associated with the unavailability of assistive aids such as the Magnifying glass and the inexperience of INEC Ad hoc staff in some cases. It is worrisome, however, that the ineffective distribution of assistive aids for PWDs can be linked to the failure to analyze and use information available to INEC on persons with disabilities and their needs.

While we reflect on the gains and challenges of the just concluded elections, The Albino Foundation is committed to supporting the commission towards a more inclusive election for persons with disabilities. The recommendations made by the foundation are indicated below.

RECOMMENDATIONS

ollowing the above findings from the observations of The Albino Foundation as regards the participation of persons with disabilities in the electoral processes, the foundation hereby makes the following recommendations:

INEC

- 1. Based on the in effective distribution of assistive aids during the general elections, The Albino Foundation recommends that a committee be set up to map out and analyze data available to INEC on persons with disabilities. This will guide the commission in procurement of the assistive aids such as the braille and Magnifying glass as well as distribution of these materials to where they are needed the most.
- 2. On the accessibility of polling units, INEC should ensure that polling units are more accessible for persons with disabilities. For areas where elevated surfaces are observed, the cubicles and accreditation desk should be placed on the level ground to allow access for persons with low mobility or those on wheel chair. Information on polling units' accessibility in FCT, Osun and Ekiti states is available from The Albino Foundation.
- 3. During the field observations, the foundation observed that persons on wheel chair found it difficult to view the voter register displayed on the wall. The foundation therefore recommends that the voter register be pasted within 4 or 5 feet above the ground
- 4. Voter education materials should be produced in accessible format for various kinds of disabilities and made available for DPOs and CSOs.
- 5. The Albino Foundation also recommend retaining and continuous training of all ad hoc staff for continuity and experience building. In addition to this, the foundation recommends increased welfare for these staff
- 6. We recommend that the commission should continuously engage with CSOs and DPOs on the issues of persons with disabilities and endeavor to accommodate the recommendations made by these organizations.
- 7. Security should be beefed up to volatile areas to avert electoral offences.
- 8. During the collation of results, the number of voters with disabilities should be indicated by INEC collation / returning officers.

INTERNATIONAL AND DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS

From the observations made by The Albino Foundation in the just concluded elections, it was obvious that the assistive aids such as the braille and the magnifying glass for PWDs are insufficient. The Albino Foundation therefore recommends that Development partners should provide funding for the procurement of assistive aids to aid the independence of PWDs during voting.

Development partners should support CSOs for more data collection on PWDs to increase access to electoral and political participation in Nigeria.

Development partners should continue to support CSOs for the sensitization of PWDs on their rights to participate in electoral and political processes.

- The Albino Foundation will continue to work closely with the training institute for the training of INEC ad-hoc staff on disability matters.
- The Albino Foundation will continue to engage political parties for more space to be made available for PWDs within their parties.
