
52nd Session of the Human Rights Council (HRC)

Over 50 people participated in the AAN Learning Forum, including 34 representatives from 31 albinism organizations across Africa and 15 international development partners. The forum, which took place in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania from 7 to 9 February of 2023, was aimed at developing the capacity of participants to mobilize resources and to advance and share strategies to advocate for the adoption of National Action Plans by their respective governments.
