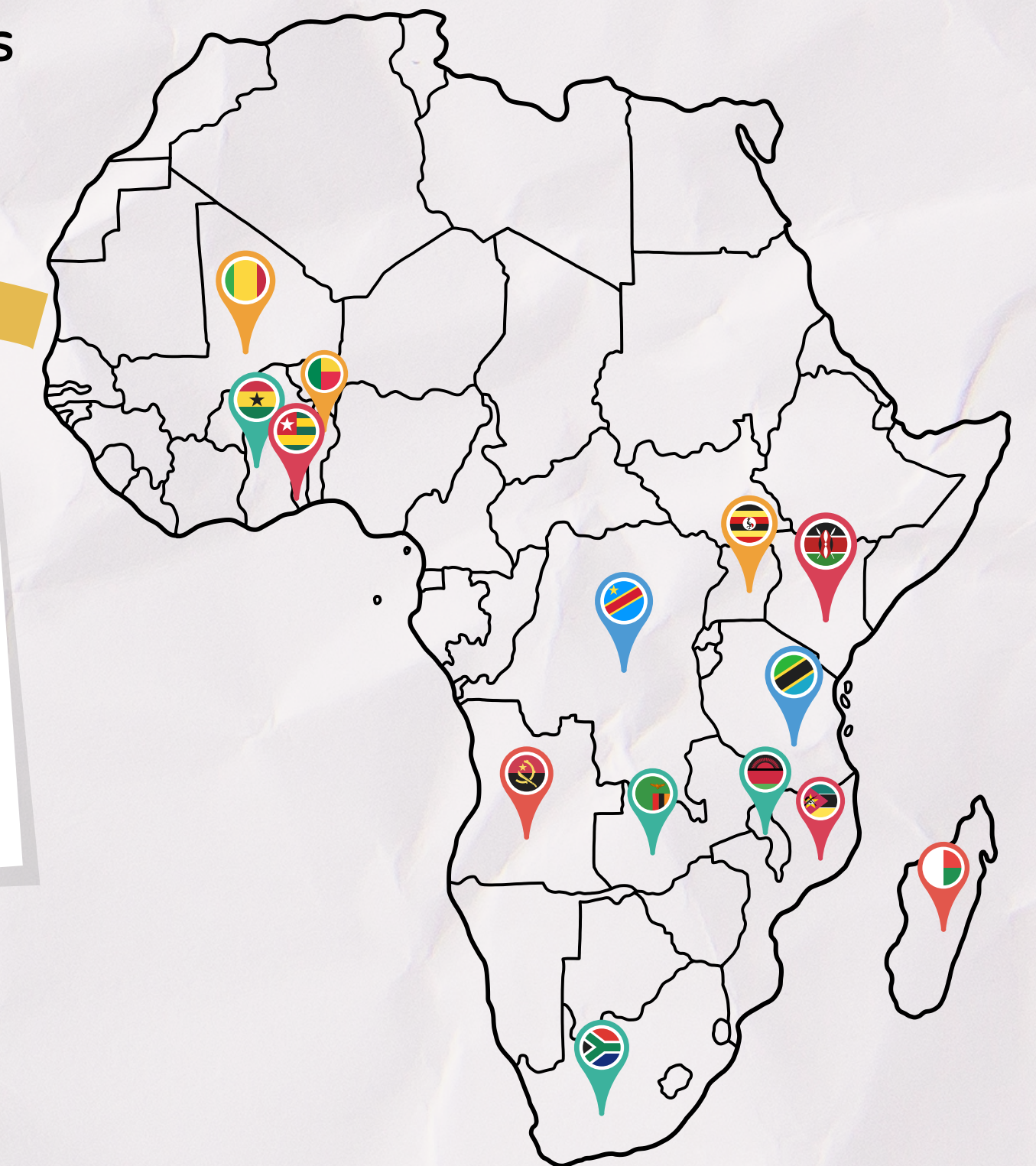


## AAN LEARNING FORUM 2023
